Learning & Teaching:

Well done to our staff team who have all completed their Creative Teacher CPD Programme. Since September, they have completed several training sessions focussed on developing their knowledge and understanding of high quality teaching and learning. The training also provided opportunities for the staff to learn about the science of learning, developing their understanding of metacognitive strategies, underpinning how children learn. Each week, Mr Rooney sets a key focus, for example, our recent focus was how we can improve the quality of scaffolding learning to ensure children with special educational needs can access lessons more effectively, to maximise their progress. Mr Rooney then regularly visits lessons to monitor the impact of the strategies.

Book Fair:

Thank you to all the parents who supported our Book Fair and bought books for their children. We would also like to thank our parent volunteers, Mrs Howarth and Mrs Swann who managed the event to ensure it was successful.

SATS:

In three weeks, week beginning 9th May, Year 6 will be sitting their SATS. We are very proud of how hard the pupils have been working to achieve well and reach their full potential. In these few weeks leading up to SATS, the children will be revising key concepts in class to ensure they are fully prepared for the tests. Please can we politely ask parents to ensure 100% attendance in the lead up to SATS and during SATS week.

On SATS week, we will be inviting Year 6 to a special Year 6 Breakfast Club. Year 6 SATS Breakfast Club will start at 8am and breakfast will be provided. We encourage parents to ensure their child attends this breakfast club, as it will provide teachers the opportunity to ensure the children are calm and relaxed before they complete their tests.

Our Easter Tuition Camp was well attended and we thank parents for supporting us with this. It was great to receive feedback from the children that they found the extra classes during the holiday helpful.
